Norma Davis attended the Human Resources Training Class presented by MTAS entitled, "Refining Your HR Core Processes," in Nashville, TN on March 30, 2023. #### **Finance and Administration Department**

Ronda & Cortez Hughey Financial Consultants

Mrs. Hughey stated that the FY22 Audit Draft was finalized and submitted, and the next steps include staying on budget for the remaining three months. Eight findings were clear, and the Finance Team is working on another eight findings and will work on policies and procedures. Rates will be gathered for moving monies (CD's) into the proper account.

#### **Fire Department**

Tanner Jenkins, Fire Chief All fire hydrants within the city limits have received their annual inspections for 2023. Several hydrants need immediate maintenance or replacement to ensure adequate fire protection. Truck 73 is expected to have repairs completed prior to the end of the month to return to service. Alderman Chastain questioned Mayor Noeman about the emergency letter to the Comptrollers regarding the Fire Engines. Mayor Noeman said he would get the letter this week. Vice Mayor Catron made a motion to accept the Fire Department Report, and the motion was 2nd By Alderman Harris: vote passed 6-0

## Parks & Public Works Department

Rudolph Middlebrooks, Interim Director

Alderman Rivers questioned the manhole covers; Mr. Middlebrooks responded that the manhole covers are \$600.00 per cover. Mr. Middlebrooks said after putting things in place, there were no more mops, mop handles, and rags found underneath the covers. Both pumps were fixed on Gainesville Lane. The volute is a curved funnel that increases in area as it approaches the discharge port. Mr. Middlebrooks said the volute has a crack in it, and it keeps the water pressure down. Sunday April 16, 2023, a pump failed, and NWS (National Water Service) was contacted. In the past the raw wells produced sand and they burnt out. Mayor Noeman, Rudolph Middlebrooks, Chris Taylor, and Mr. Hall worked with the problem on Sunday April 16, 2023, to correct the problem with the water. Mayor Noeman said he found six more water leaks. Mr. Middlebrooks reported that Mason Charleston Road and the Lift Station has back-up, into some of the constituents' homes.

The pressure of the water shoots it up into the air opposed to pushing it down. Mayor Noeman said he called someone to purchase the part (flow valve) for repairs because this was a fault of the city.

# Mrs. Linda Smith

Mrs. Smith informed Mayor Noeman and the Board about repairs needed in her home regarding water damage when it rains. Mrs. Smith said her commodes and tub backup with sewer, and stated she has dealt with the problem for about the last thirty years. Mrs. Smith

said she is looking into hiring an Attorney, due to the serious issues as cracked tile, vanity issues, and mold. When the pumps shut off, Mrs. Smith said she can expect a disaster. Mayor Noeman said he will solve the problem in a week. Mayor Noeman said the part was ordered to repair the problem.

(Street Patching) – Mayor Noeman recommends holding up on cold packs for street patching, and pave the streets opposed to patching them.

Alderman Toliver made a motion to accept the Parks & Public Works Department Report, and the motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Alderman Rivers: vote passed 6-0



### **Police Department**

Chief Jewell and Alderman Harris are working on a Grant that should be received by the end of May. The Grant has been approved but not received, and the information will be submitted to Finance. Alderman Harris made a motion to accept the Police Department Report, and the motion was  $2^{nd}$  by Alderwoman Catron: vote passed 6-0

Alderman Rivers questioned the revisions requested to amend the Towns' Charter, and Mayor Noeman said he would have a Special Call Meeting to do so.
